Survey of Likely General Election Voters RE:

The information below was gathered by Cygnal through an advanced multi-mode (Live + SMS) survey of likely general election voters in Michigan's proposed new 7th congressional district per the Chestnut plan, conducted November 17, 2021 – November 18, 2021. The Chestnut CD-7 survey has a sample size of n414 and a MoE of ±4.81% at a 95% confidence interval.

The political environment is very favorable for a Republican candidate.

The new Chestnut 7th Congressional District is poised to send a Republican to Congress in 2022. President Biden is severely underwater in the district with a 52% majority strongly disapproving of his job performance. Worse, 63% of Independents disapprove of Biden.

Republicans lead generic ballot by 10 points

A generic Republican candidate holds a commanding 10% lead over a Democratic candidate. Independent voters favor a Republican by a full 18%.

Slotkin is in bad shape

Democratic incumbent Elissa Slotkin is well known, but not well liked in the district. Slotkin is politically polarizing as Democratic voters are uniform in their support of her, Republican are uniform in their opposition and Independents are split. Leaving Slotkin with little room for growth in the new district.

Slotkin is losing and is in significant peril

Combine a strong disadvantage on the generic ballot with weak personal image ratings and Congresswoman Slotkin becomes unlikely to win re-election in 2022. Polled against two different named Republican challengers, Slotkin is losing in both, and pulls in only 42% and 43% of the vote, respectively. Incumbents polling in the low-40s are in significant peril for re-election.



METHODOLOGY: The probabilistic survey was conducted November 17-18, 2021 with 414 (Chestnut CD-7) likely general election voters. It has a margin of error of ±4.81%. Known registered voters were interviewed via live agents calling cell phones and landlines, and voters received invitations to participate in the survey via SMS with a secure link tied to their voter record. The survey was weighted minimally to a likely general election population.
